PORT ROYAL LADIES' GOLF ASSOCIATION

General Information

The Port Royal Ladies' Golf Association – familiarly referred to as “the 18-holers” is a group representing a wide range of skills and experience with the game. The unifying bond among members includes the pleasure of a shot well executed, whether one's own or someone else's and the enjoyment of golf's fresh air, moderate exercise, and companionship. We meet each Tuesday morning for organized golf events, as specified on the following schedule. We meet several times through the year for potluck dinners at the Beach House.

We welcome to membership any adult female Sports or Golf member of the Port Royal Plantation Club with a current established USGA handicap of 40 or less. (A few events require playing to a handicap no greater than 36.) Annual dues are \$40.00 payable by Jan. 31 (\$20.00 after June 30). Checks are to be made out to PRLGA and submitted to the PRLGA Treasurer. The PRLGA is happy to have new members at any time. A prospective member may play in a Tuesday event once and only when the format is an individual event.

For Tuesday events, sign up in the Pro Shop before 5 p.m. on the Sunday preceding the day of play. Each player's account will be charged \$3 for that day's game. Members who do not cancel by Monday at 5:00 p.m. will be charged the \$3.00 fee. To be eligible for a prize, your dues must be paid in full **AND** your score must be posted immediately following the event. Cancellation of special events and major tournaments is the responsibility of the Pro Shop

To be eligible to play in the Member/Member Match Play or the Championship Stroke Play Tournament, a player must be a member in good standing of the PRLGA. The maximum handicap allowed in these tournaments is 36 strokes. Players whose handicaps exceed 36 are welcome in tournament play but are limited to 36 handicap strokes.

Eligibility for Most Improved Golfer award in any year is based on a minimum of twenty-six (26) rounds played on the Port Royal courses as an active member between January 1 and November 30, inclusive. The Most Chip-Ins and Most Birdies awards are calculated from November 1 through October 31.

The PRLGA fields one (1) team in the Low Country Team Play Association, using our six lowest handicapped players. Handicaps as of January 1 are used for team selection.

The PRLGA Board of Directors (Executive Committee and Committee Chairwomen) meet once a month. Any member is welcome to attend.

DESCRIPTION OF EVENTS AND TOURNAMENTS (18 holers)

AMAZON – Individual – 100% Hep. – Flighted

This is a game of rotating tees. On Planter's Row and Barony, play the black tees on hole #1, the green tees on #2 and white on #3. Continue this rotation for the rest of the round. On Robber's Row, play the white tees on #1, the black on #2 and the green on #3 and continue this rotation for the rest of the round.

BETTER BALL OF TWOSOME – 90% Hcp.

One best ball of twosome on each hole determines the winning twosome.

1 BEST BALL OF FOURSOME – 80% Hep.

One best ball of foursome on each hole determines the winners.

2 BEST BALLS OF FOURSOME – 90% Hcp.

Two best balls on each hole determine the winners.

BINGO BANGO BONGO – 100% Hep. – Flighted

This is a point game. The highest number of points wins. One point is scored for the first on the green, the first in the hole, and the lowest net score on the hole. A point may be given to each player in case of a tie for the low net. Play *must* be in order to determine the first on the green and the first in the hole.

BLIND HOLES – 90% Hcp.

The pro shop selects the 3 holes to be dropped from total score after play has begun. The winning score is based on the lowest 15 hole total.

BLIND NINE – 100% Hcp.

A random draw of nine holes is made prior to play by various players. Holes drawn are placed in an envelope and sealed. First group in opens the envelope. Score is based on low net score of "sealed" 9 holes.

CHAMPIONSHIP STROKE PLAY TOURNAMENT – 100% Hcp.

In the Championship Flight, player with the low gross score is Ladies' Club Champion and low net is 1st place in that flight. Winners in other flights will be 1st and 2nd place low net scores.

CHOOSE NINE – 100% Hcp.

Two- or four-person team chooses favorite nine holes to include 2 par 3's, 2 par 5's and 5 par 4's. Holes are circled before beginning play. Lowest score for 9 holes wins.

CRIER'S MATCH – 80% Hcp.

Each player or team picks their 3 worst holes, and changes these 3 scores to par. Lowest score wins.

FLAG TOURNAMENT – Individual – 100% Hep.

This is a par game tournament. The object of the game is to plant your flag the farthest point around the golf course. Each player is provided a small flag with her name attached. Using full handicaps, each player plays until he or she has used the number of strokes equaling par plus her handicap, and at this point the player's flag is planted. If a player still has strokes left after 18 holes, then that player continues to play until all shots have been used, which in some cases might extend to two extra holes.

FORGIVE AND FORGET – Individual or Twosome – 100% Hcp.
Individual or team selects their 9 best par 4's, 3 best par 3's and 3 best par 5's.

IRISH FOUR BALLS – 100% Hcp.
Foursomes. Holes 1-6: ONE low-net ball. Holes 7-11: TWO lownet balls. Holes 12-15: THREE low-net balls. Holes 16-18: ALL four score. Lowest team score wins.

LAST CHANCE TOURNAMENT – 100% Hcp.
For those who did not win ANYTHING in the two major tournaments i.e., Member/Member Match Play or Championship Stroke. Flighted. Stroke play. One prize per flight (three flights) for low net awarded at the December Annual Awards Luncheon.

LOW GROSS/LOW NET – 100% Hcp.
Stroke play.

LOW PUTTS – Person or Team with lowest putts wins.

MEMBER/MEMBER MATCH PLAY – 100% Hcp.
Maximum 10 strokes differential between partners. If more than 10 strokes, the extra strokes will be deducted from the higher handicap partner. Two-day event. Hole-by-hole two-person team competition. Better ball of each team wins each hole. A tied hole is halved. The match ends when one team has a greater margin of holes won than are left to play – e.g., a team leading by 2 holes, with 1 hole left to play is winner. Event is flighted and handicapped, with strokes taken as they fall on the card.
Note: Some USGA rules differ for match play in contrast to stroke play.

NASSAU – Individual – 2-some or 4-some – 100/90/80% Hcp
Best net score for front nine, back nine, or total 18 are winners.

ODD/EVEN – 100% Hcp
Twosomes. Before play begins, team chooses which player is to score on the odd-numbered holes with the other scoring on the even-numbered holes. Low team total wins.

PORT ROYAL LADIES' CUP MATCHES – 100% Hcp.
Mixed teams of 18- and 9-holers. Sign up individually in Pro Shop. Two day competition. Tuesday format: Scramble, Step Aside. Thursday format: Shamble. Entry fee includes Thursday luncheon.

PORT ROYAL MIXER – 100% Hcp.
Four-person teams. Score ONE best net ball on par 5 holes, TWO best net on par 4 holes, THREE best net on par 3's. Lowest score wins.

QUEEN OF CLUBS – Individual
The player with the lowest net for designated Queen of Clubs events (once for each month [more or less] from January to September) is the Queen of Clubs for that month. In case of ties, a match of cards will be used. No player may be Queen of Clubs more than one month. The nine monthly Queens of Clubs have a shootout to determine the Queen of Clubs for the year. The shootout will occur in late afternoon followed by a Pot Luck Awards Dinner.

QUEEN OF CLUBS SHOOTOUT – 100% Hep.
The monthly queen of clubs winners will participate in a Shootout to determine an overall Queen of Clubs for the year. The lady with the highest net score on the first hole will be eliminated. One lady will be eliminated on each hole until the final Queen of Clubs is determined. A chip off will break ties if necessary.

RABBIT – Individual – 100%
This is a low ball tournament. The object of the game is to have the rabbit at the end of the last hole. It does not matter which hole you end on. On the first hole you play the rabbit is on the loose. The first player to win a hole is said to "hold the rabbit". The rabbit stays with his owner

until another player wins a hole by herself (not tied). If you hold the rabbit and do not at least tie for low ball, the rabbit is set loose. Those players holding rabbits in each group at the end of the play for the day split the prize money evenly.

REVERSE IRISH FOUR BALLS – 100% Hep.

Foursomes. Holes 1-3: all four balls score; holes 4-7: three low net balls; holes 8-12: two low net balls; and holes 13-18: one low net ball. Lowest team score wins.

RINGER TOURNAMENT–100% Hcp.

Two consecutive Tuesdays. Flighted. At end of second day, player chooses best net score for each hole. Lowest score wins.

ROUND ROBIN – Individual or Twosome – 100% Hep.

The object of the game is to win the most holes. This game is played in foursomes. This game consists of three six-hole matches. Partners change every 6 holes, so each player is engaged in three six-hole matches with each of the other players in the foursome as partners. On the 7th and 13th holes the partners switch so that each player is teamed up with the other members of the group. Points are won by the teams with low net ball total for the two partners. This game may also be played as individuals playing match play against each other individual in the foursome.

SADIE HAWKINS DAY – 100% Hep.

Each lady will invite a man who is not her spouse to play in her group. The format will be match play, the better ball of ladies (net) vs. the better ball of the men (net). Each group will play the entire 18 holes. If the total number of holes won by all the ladies is greater than the total of holes won by all the men, then the ladies will have "caught" the men in Sadie Hawkins Day tradition and divide the prize money. If not, the men divide the prize money.

SANTA'S CRAZY SCRAMBLE – an event designed to be completely fun as ALL monies collected for this event go to Deep Well! Each player in foursome is given a number (1-2-3-4) and each foursome has one die. The rest of the instructions for play will be printed out at start of play as each hole will be played in a different scramble format. Have fun!

SHAMBLE – 80% Hep.

After teeing off, the team selects the best positioned drive. From that spot, each player in the foursome hits her second shot and continues to play her own ball to finish out the hole. Choose the ONE best net of the foursome on each hole for scoring. The lowest team score wins.

SIX/SIX/SIX-100% Hcp.

Twosomes. On holes 1-6, select the preferred drive, then play alternate shot format. On holes 7-12, play the better ball of two. Holes 13-18 use aggregate score of team. Lowest score wins.

SKINS – Individual or Twosome – 100% Hep. Flighted

The player with the lowest net score on each hole wins a skin provided her score is not tied by another player in the group. A skin not awarded on one hole is carried over to the next hole. This procedure is followed until a player wins a hole with the single lowest net score. The player winning the hole also wins each hole that has been carried over. It is possible for one player to win 18 holes by having the lowest single score on the 18th hole, provided the low score on each of the 17 holes was tied by at least two players.

STABLEFORD – Individual – 2-Lady – 4-Lady – 100% Hcp.

Net Scoring: Bogey = 1, Par = 2, Birdie = 3, Eagle = 4, Double Eagle = 8. For 2 or 4 person team compute the aggregate score to determine winning team.

T AND F EVENT – 100% Hcp.

Total net scores count only on holes beginning with T or F (2, 3, 4, 5, 10, 12, 13, 14, 15).

TENNESSEE WALTZ – 100% Hcp.

Score ONE best net ball on hole #1, TWO best net balls on hole #2, THREE best net balls on #3.

Continue this format through 18 holes. Lowest score wins.

THROW-OUT EVENT – 95% Hcp.

At the end of the round, deduct 1 hole from front 9 and 1 hole from back nine from your score. Lowest score wins.

TWELVE-HOLE RINGER – 100% Hcp.

Select your THREE best par 3's. SIX best par 4's, and THREE best par 5's. Lowest score wins

TWO-LADY CHAPMAN – 90% Hcp.

Both drive from tee. Each plays the second shot using partner's tee ball where it lies. After each has made the second shot, one ball is chosen to finish the hole. Partners alternate shots until the ball is holed out. Net score uses the sum of the team's 90% handicap divided by 2.

TURKEY DAY EVENT – 100% Hcp.

Individual event by flights. Stroke play. Low net of each flight wins gift certificate from a local store.

WSCGA

Women's South Carolina Golf Assn. Tournament Members with eligible handicap (36 or lower) may participate.

YELLOW BALL - Foursome – 100% Hep.

This is a low ball tournament. The object of the game is to win the most holes. In this game on the first tee, each player must select the holes for which she will use the yellow ball. Only the yellow golf ball score counts for the team score. In a threesome, each player will use the yellow ball six times. In a foursome, two of the players will use the yellow ball on five holes and two of the players will use it on four holes. If a team loses the yellow ball, there will be no team score counted from that point on.

BY-LAWS OF THE PORT ROYAL LADIES' GOLF ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I

Section 1. Name: The name of the organization shall be "Port Royal Ladies' Golf Association."

Section 2. Location: The principal office of the Association shall be located in Port Royal Plantation, Hilton Head Island, South Carolina.

Section 3. Purpose: The purpose of the Association is to encourage and promote the game of golf and kindred activities through friendly competition among its members.

ARTICLE II

Section 1. Qualifications: Any adult female golf member of the Port Royal Plantation club may obtain membership in the Association by payment of annual dues. Said member must have a handicap of 40. (Those with a handicap of 40 will be required to play to a 36 handicap in major tournament for equitable flight distribution.)

Section 2. Fiscal Year: The fiscal year shall begin on January 1 and shall end of December 31.

Section 3. Dues and Assessments: Dues to be determined by a decision of the executive board. Assessments for special purposes may be made only when proposed by the Executive Committee and ratified by two-thirds (2/3) of the membership at a meeting of the members.

Section 4. Delinquency: Payment of dues of current members must be made on or before January 31. The Treasurer shall then advise the member by letter or telephone that her dues are

delinquent and, if dues are not received within seven (7) days, the member is ineligible to win a prize in the regular Tuesday tournaments. After an additional thirty (30) days of such delinquency the member's name shall be dropped from the rolls of the Association.

ARTICLE III

Section 1. Officers and Duties: The officers of the Port Royal Ladies' Golf Association shall consist of a President, Vice- President, Treasurer and Secretary, all of whom shall be elected by the members at the Annual meeting. The term of office shall be for one year, and no person may serve in the same office for more than two consecutive years.

a. The President of each calendar year shall preside over all Annual and Executive meetings unless she is unable to do so. Said President will appoint special committees and chairpersons to work with her during her term as chairperson.

b. The Vice-President shall perform the duties of the President when required and such other duties as the President may delegate, including acting as membership chairman.

c. The Secretary shall keep the records and minutes of all meetings of the Association, conduct correspondence, and issue all notices proper to that office.

d. The Treasurer shall collect and disburse the funds of the Association, keep proper records of all financial transactions and maintain the membership rolls.

Section 2. Nominating Procedures: The President shall appoint a Nominating committee consisting of three members, one of whom shall be the President. The Committee shall propose names of members for the offices of President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer, and shall post the names on the bulletin board 30 days prior to the Annual Meeting. Further nominations may be made in writing by any ten (10) members by sending such nominations to the Secretary by no later than 15 days prior to the annual Meeting. These names shall then be posted on the bulletin board. No ballots for persons other than those nominated, as outlined, shall be received or counted at the election.

ARTICLE IV

Section 1. Executive Committee: The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Tournament Chairman. Three (3) members of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum.

Section 2. Duties and Powers: It shall be the duty of the Executive Committee to carry out the objectives of the Association subject to these by-laws. It shall have the power to fill any vacancy in an elective office until the succeeding annual meeting and to make such rules and regulations, not inconsistent with these by-laws, as it deems necessary.

ARTICLE V

Section 1. Meetings: A meeting of the members shall be at the discretion of the Executive Committee. A meeting shall be called by the Executive committee at the request of any ten (10) members. Notice of such meetings shall be posted on the bulletin board a week prior to such a meeting.

Section 2. Quorum: Twenty-five percent (25%) of the regular members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the members.

Section 3. Absentee Vote: Absent members shall have the right to vote by sending written notice to the Secretary prior to any meeting.

Section 4. Annual Meeting: The Annual Meeting and Awards Luncheon of the Association shall be held within the first two weeks of December.

ARTICLE VI

These by-laws may be amended at any meeting of the members at which there is a quorum by an affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3rds) of those voting in person or by proxy. The Secretary must give each member ten (10) days notification prior to such action.
